

Hot Picks








Cynthia takes off with her dog, her beautiful yoga instructor and her Dad's money. What could go wrong? Shortlisted for this year's Ockhams.

The Dukes of Weathershire Friday 18 May, 12.30-1.00pm


Original folk rock tunes with a modern twist...two guitars, two chaps with tales to tell...

Soulful, heart-warming songs from a Nelson-based performer. His music ranges from gospel, rock, pop and folk.




Aotearoa at the Library
