Our most popular children's book last year was Diary of a Wimpy Kid: The Ugly Truth by Jeff Kinney.

Thrillers are the most popular genre, with 62,392 thrillers issued to our customers in the past year. 3,210 of those were James Patterson books.



We receive about 65 lost property items each month at the Elma Turner Library – everything from passports to teddy bears to USB sticks.



Last year there were over 34,000 logged sessions on our public computers.

We have over 178 physical magazine titles in the library and over 3220 digital magazine titles online via Libby.

The Chills: The Triumph and Tragedy of Martin Phillipps

In this portrait of Dunedin musician Martin Phillipps from The Chills, "we bear witness to one man's universal battle with the fear of failure and the jarring reality of his own mortality". At age 54, Phillipps received devastating medical news. In this documentary he attempts to reconcile with demons - reflecting on a past self that was destined for great things but instead was thwarted by addiction and financial trouble. He was to realise his remaining ambition with a sense of urgency. What is often dark subject matter is met with his startling sense of humour, and of course there is the music. Anyone wanting to relive or visit the Dunedin music scene of the 80's will appreciate this excellent NZ documentary about an eccentric musician whose heavenly pop hits earned him a spot in NZ music history forever.

Individual courses cover Business, Design, IT, Marketing, Photography, Video, Music, Animation, and Education... Learn Excel, PowerPoint, Photoshop, CAD and much more. The site tracks your progress, you can create playlists, look at your learning history and get course certificates.

- Go to the *Research databases* section of the online resources page of our website to find Linkedin Learning.
- Get started by entering your full library barcode number (2826000....) and your pin number. Contact us if you do not know or do not have a pin.
- If you know what you want to learn, use the search box at top of screen to search for skills, subjects, or software.
- If you want to find out what's on offer, click "Browse" beside the search box, and drill down through the menus to find business, creative or technology related courses.
- Once you find the course you want, take it! Make sure you have headphones if you are working in a shared space.
- The "my learning" space (icon top right of screen) shows what courses you have started and/or completed.



Public seed library

Now is the perfect time to start planning and preparing for the new year's crops.

Nelson's Elma Turner Library is home to the first public seed library in the top of the South Island. A set of drawers that is full of treasures. There are over 200 varieties of seed in our collection, mostly made up of edibles but with a growing collection of ornamentals, natives and a few exotic species.

Nelson Seed Library is run by volunteers and works on a self-service, trust based system. The idea is that people can take seeds away, grow them, take some for a harvest and save some for seed, which is then returned to the library to share with the rest of the community.

Anyone can borrow or return seeds and the volunteers hold drop-in sessions every Thursday between 11.30am - 1.30pm. Stop by for a chat!
